The first Healthy Buildings Conference was held in Stockholm one year after the 1987 Indoor Air Conference. Since then the Conference has been held in Washington DC, Budapest, Milan and Oslo.

The programme of every conference has focussed on practical solutions based on scientific data. Each conference has also produced state-of-the-art reports on concurrent topics. The Healthy Buildings 2000 Conference will be organized according to these principles. The work will begin at the Indoor Air '99 Conference.

AIM AND SCOPE

Healthy Buildings 2000 Conference aims at processing the latest knowledge from indoor air quality research, construction techniques and product development into economical and safe solutions for healthier living and working environments. The scope of the Conference covers all building types in all climate conditions.

- Design methods for better indoor air quality
- Specifications for healthy building design
- Prediction and calculation of indoor climate
- Control of moisture and mould in structures and buildings
- Moistureproof materials and structures

- o Ventilation and air quality
- o Clean ventilation systems
- o Cleaning of air from particles and gases
- o Cleaning for healthier indoor climate
- o Measurement of IAQ and thermal climate
- o Allergies and other health effects
- o Diagnosis of IAQ problems
- o Experience from remedial measures
- o Codes and guidelines for healthy buildings
- o Governmental and voluntary programmes for healthy buildings
- o Business opportunities for IAQ products and services

FORMAT

Healthy Buildings 2000 will be a working conference. In the plenary sessions, leading experts from science and industry will review the current status of IAQ issues. The workshops of the Conference will be initiated at Indoor Air '99. An Internet discussion forum will be arranged for pre-conference work. During the Conference, a workshop can have one or several meetings. Papers will be presented in the poster sessions, where the authors will give a short introduction of the poster.

PROCEEDINGS

All papers presented during the Conference will be published in the Conference Proceedings, which will be available in CD-ROM format.

Printed keynote lectures and abstracts will be distributed to the conference delegates. A printed version of the full papers will be on sale during the Conference. After the Conference, the abstracts and workshop reports will be published on the Conference www-server.
